

The Moulton Memorial



HISTORY: The Eliza and Dr. Peter Moulton Memorial was built sometime between 1914 and 1917, erected in honor of New Rochelle residents Eliza Moulton and her father, Dr. Peter Moulton.

While her father was one of the first physicians in New Rochelle, Eliza Moulton was known as being one of the instigators of the movement for the prevention of cruelty to animals in Westchester county through her work with the ASPCA. She was further recognized for her daily visits to the wounded soldiers at Fort Slocum; and for providing a home to young women who did not have shelter. Eliza was considered a great contributor to the City of New Rochelle, both financially and spiritually.

RESTORATION: The bronze light fixture and plaque were restored, and the granite stone and fountain bowl were cleaned. It is hoped that the light fixture and fountain will be made operable.
